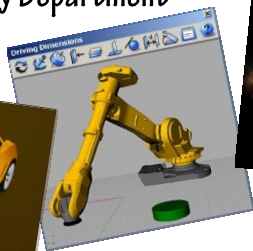

Are you looking to **enhance** and **distinguish** your **resume**? Are you interested in other **cultures** and ways of life? Do you enjoy **creative** writing, music, and drama? Do you dream of **traveling** to Europe? If you answered yes to any or all, consider studying **French** or **German**. Contrary to popular misconceptions, French and German are *not* more difficult than Spanish (ask your French/German-studying peers!) and research shows us that achievement is based largely on your *motivation to learn!* So, if you're *interested* in French or German, you're already halfway to success! You already study a language here at FHS? Most students find **learning** a second foreign language to be **easier than the first**. As a bonus, in many cases, you can earn college credit by examination after having studied French or German to fulfill humanities course requirements.
